The webinar provided the audience with different insights of how to operate in online education during the coronacrisis.

European MOOC Consortium (EMC) staff and leadership seminar

The European MOOC Consortium was established three years ago under coordination of EADTU to strengthen the continuing education sector by making MOOCs a widely considered option for employers seeking to close knowledge and skills gaps in the economy and for workers interested in changing careers. Also, EMC promotes collaboration between its partners in order to build a complementary offering and taking a leading role in developing the discourse relating to MOOCs and other innovative developments in online learning in Europe.

On 24 September 2020, EADTU organised the second seminar for staff and leadership of the European MOOC Platforms FutureLearn, France Université Numérique (FUN), OpenupED, Miríadax and EduOpen within the EMC-LM project. This year's focus of sharing expertise and experience was on:

- MOOC platforms offering pedagogies and services to universities
- Labour market collaboration
- Microcredentials for MOOC based programmes (Common Microcredential Framework)
- How did COVID19 impact the role of MOOC providers?

Micro-credentials linked to the Bologna Key Commitments (Microbol)

The <u>MICROBOL project</u> supports ministries and stakeholders in exploring, within the Bologna Process, whether and how the existing Bologna tools can be used and/or need to be adapted to be applicable to microcredentials.

In this project an international consortium organizes various meetings and workshops where governments, experts and stakeholders will come together to evaluate the current practices and policies relating to microcredentials. Based on the findings of these meetings, a common European framework for microcredentials will be proposed. EADTU is contributing as expert to the Microbol project. This two-year project is co-funded by Erasmus+ KA3 Support to Policy reform, and, more specifically "Support to the implementation of European Higher Education Area (EHEA) reforms". The kick-off meeting was on the 31st of August 2020.

Under the Microbol project, the <u>MICROBOL Desk Research Report</u> on microcredentials is now published. This report examines the current status of microcredentials, which have attracted interest in recent times as a means to increase the effectiveness and flexibility of higher education and to provide upskilling and reskilling opportunities for the labour force. The report was compiled by EUA and serves as a starting point to further investigate how micro-credentials can be linked to the Bologna Key Commitments.

People's everyday experiences during the pandemic

The Open University (OU) in partnership with the Young foundation have explored the experiences of 600 people during the pandemic. The public was asked to share real-time experiences using the OU's citizen science platform nQuire (nquire.org.uk), in an effort to capture the impact of Covid19 on the future of community life and wellbeing. A weekly analysis of the data showed that community solidarity was high in the agenda during the first few weeks, family dynamics were shifted for good and for worse, there was a great impact on mental health, while access to physical space helped people cope.

OUC Vice-Rector in the Guide2Research 2020 ranking

Professor Yannis Manolopoulos, Vice Rector of the Open University of Cyprus, has been recognized as a top scientist in Greece according to the Guide2Research 2020 - Computer Science and Electronics Top Scientists Ranking. Professor Manolopoulos is ranked 10th of all Computer Scientists working in Greek universities and research centers among 6.000 scientists profiled worldwide based on their H-index value of Google Scholar. Only scientists with an H-index of 40 or above were considered, provided that their publications are in the field of computer science and indexed to the Digital Bibliography and Library Project (DBLP).

FernUniversität successful in international digital academic collaboration funding bid

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) is funding four international digital teaching projects at the FernUniversität in Hagen, which makes it the best-represented German higher education institution in this 5.5 Mio Euro program that is funding 41 institutions in total. It was created to promote virtual mobility and collaboration in order to address the challenges of the global pandemic and to ensure an international dimension in blended study programs at German universities. The FernUni projects are integrated into Master programs in Educational Sciences, History, Law, and Informatics. They use various approaches of international collaboration, such as blended international mobility, collaboration within a virtual lab and joint creation of educational products.

A Digital Edge: Essentials for the Online Learner

The National Institute for Digital Learning (NIDL) at Dublin City University (DCU) has launched a new MOOC on the FutureLearn platform designed to help students to learn how to learn online. This free two-week course draws on the new European LifeComp Framework and is based on the assumption that learning online is different from learning in a physical classroom; it requires a different set of skills to master. The course is supported by the Irish Universities Association and is codesigned and co-facilitated by learners for learners. The first offering Began on Monday 21st September and has already attracted over 4,000 registrations.
