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

### **EADTU Mobility Matrix published**

Recently EADTU presented and published the [EADTU Mobility Matrix](#). It was developed in response to the fast growth of new student mobility schemes using online education. To further promote innovation in mobility and prevent potential confusion of different schemes and linked definitions, EADTU developed this matrix. The Mobility Matrix aligns with current mobility schemes of the European Commission, notably Erasmus+ KA1 Erasmus Mobility and the Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters Programmes, as well as with the ambitions of the EU and European Commission with regard to educational collaboration and mobility. It extends current schemes with a coherent view on virtual mobility and on open virtual mobility. The matrix presents three forms of mobility: physical exchange mobility, virtual exchange mobility and open virtual exchange mobility. As virtual mobility is frequently confused with online distance education we also have added a column for distance education in order to compare virtual mobility with transnational online distance education.

The Open University of Cyprus leads a new research project, which has secured funding of 1m euro **under the European programme Horizon 2020 – Twinning**. The project aims to establish a network of researchers with key expertise in the areas of informatics and digital literacy, creating the Cyprus Center for Algorithmic Transparency, a distributed research center, at OUC. #### E-Learning Research Report 2017, Universitat Oberta de Catalunya

Learning via mobile devices, e-assessments, MOOCs (massive open online courses) and virtual reality are, in this order, the four most published e-learning topics in 2017. This is the conclusion of the *E-Learning Research Report 2017* by the UOC's eLearn Center, the online research, innovation and learning centre which analysed the **855 pieces of scientific research** published on this subject area during this period that had the greatest impact. ## New books by Professor Michalinos Zembylas

Two new books edited by Michalinos Zembylas, Professor of Educational Theory and Curriculum Studies at the MA in Educational Studies of the Open University of Cyprus, namely "[Critical Human Rights, Citizenship, and Democracy Education Entanglements](#)" and "[Social Just Pedagogies: Posthumanist, Feminist and Materialist Perspectives in Higher Education](#)", are published by Bloomsbury Publishing. The first book presents new scholarly research that views human rights, democracy and citizenship education as a critical project, while the second book addresses issues such as contemporary philosophical issues in higher education and how we can create socially just pedagogies and a socially just university.

## OTHER NEWS



### The Ministers from EHEA have adopted the Paris Communiqué, 25th May 2018

In preparation of the communiqué, EADTU has brought forward position papers on lifelong learning. Besides degree education, the universities are to be stimulated to organise continuous education and open education as a core business, using online modes of teaching for flexibilisation. Governments have to provide a structural place for these areas in their higher education systems. In the final version of the Communiqué, this focus on lifelong learning, digitalisation and flexibilisation is now integrated.

In the Communiqué, it is said that:

"Digitalisation plays a role in all areas of society and we recognise its potential to transform how higher education is delivered and how people learn at different stages of their lives. We call on our higher education institutions to prepare their students and support their teachers to act creatively in a digitalised environment.

We will enable our education systems to make better use of digital and blended education, with appropriate quality assurance, in order to enhance lifelong and flexible learning, foster digital skills and competences, improve data analysis, educational research and foresight, and remove regulatory obstacles to the provision of open and digital education. We call on the BFUG to take the issue of digitalisation forward in the next working period".

To give follow up on this reference, governments and universities should now start a dialogue on

how to fulfill this important task together, also in consultation with social partners.

This edition will be built on [the previous 1.0 version](#), transformed and elaborated; version 2.0 is based on all the comments and the feedback received. In addition, [a final conference](#) will be organised in Krakow (Poland) 9 November. This International Scientific Conference and Business-Academia Forum “Upgrading Business Competence Globally for today and tomorrow” has seven different tracks.
